Possible Introduction of Committee Measures

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 111
Establishes statewide audio newspaper service for individuals who are blind or print-disabled.
- SB 187
Requires Department of Human Services to release and disclose reports and records of child abuse investigations upon request of member of Legislative Assembly for purposes of responding to constituent's complaint or grievance or for the conduct of legislative business.
- SB 288
Authorizes limited disclosure of child welfare records to specified individuals if purpose of disclosure is to determine if Department of Human Services acted within scope of department's authority.
- SB 571 **
Appropriates moneys to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for payment to Investing in Boardman's Healthy Future Capital Campaign. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- SB 579
Allows hospital to appoint patient advocate to make health care decisions on behalf of patient incapable of making health care decisions.
- SB 563
Allows retired health care provider to register as emergency health care provider and to provide health care services without license or certification during Governor-declared emergency.
