SB 94

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03/16/2011 AGENDA: Authorizes Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt uniform standards for health care financial and administrative transactions of specified persons.

SB 97

Directs certain health professional regulatory boards to adopt rules by January 1, 2014, requiring licensees to document participation in continuing education opportunities relating to cultural competency approved by Oregon Health Authority.

SB 101

Authorizes payment for dental services under Family Health Insurance Assistance Program and under private health option of Health Care for All Oregon Children program.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 709

Imposes restrictions on health benefit plan that provides coverage for pharmacy services or prescription drugs.

SB 224

Modifies provisions relating to regulation of physician assistants.
