Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2013
Abolishes Advisory Council for Electrologists and Permanent Color Technicians and Tattoo Artists and transfers duties of council to Oregon Health Licensing Agency.
- HB 2325 A** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates Oregon Elder Abuse Task Force for purpose of studying and making legislative recommendations related to elder abuse.
- HB 2856 A
Requires Department of Human Services to coordinate with other state agencies and local governments to find ways to reduce administrative and resource burdens on human services providers.
- HB 2047
Designates private residential boarding school that provides academic education and therapeutic care as "child-caring agency" subject to licensure requirements of Department of Human Services.
- HB 2107
Allows physician or provider to disregard declaration for mental health treatment if principal is committed to state hospital or facility in certain circumstances.
- HB 3311 A
Requires Oregon Health Authority to explore ways to improve birth outcomes for women who face disproportionately greater risk of poor birth outcomes and to report to legislative committees in February 2012.
