Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2036 A
Clarifies application of statutes related to unlawful discrimination against persons with disabilities.
- HB 2367 A
Allows county with population of 400,000 or less to offer law library services in lieu of acquiring, maintaining or operating law library.
- HB 2681
Prohibits corporation or cooperative from denying director indemnification or payments for expenses in connection with proceeding if corporation or cooperative previously granted indemnification or payments.
- HB 2708 A
Shields consigned work of fine art or consignor's portion of proceeds from sale of consigned work of fine art from claims of creditor of consignee.
- HB 3125 A
Requires applicant for license, tag or permit to hunt wildlife with firearms to attest that applicant is not convicted felon and has not been found guilty except for insanity.
- HB 3166 A
Establishes statutory limit of six years after date of decision for person to file request with Land Use Board of Appeals for review of land use decision or limited land use decision.

HB 2925 A

Requires release assistance officer or deputy to include in release decision order prohibiting defendant from contacting victim while defendant is in custody for sex crime or crime constituting domestic violence.

HB 3151

Authorizes forfeiting agency to use forfeiture proceeds to fund drug treatment.
