Possible Introduction of Committee Measures

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3209

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Permits former prisoners of war, recipients of Congressional Medal of Honor, persons awarded Purple Heart medal and gold star family members to register vehicle by paying one-time vehicle registration fee.

HB 3611

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Requires person who submits death certificate after decedent's death was caused by suicide to make reasonable efforts to ascertain and to indicate on death certificate whether decedent was veteran, whether decedent served in combat and where decedent served if decedent served in combat.

SJM 3

Urges Congress to mandate payment for treatment of military sexual trauma provided outside veterans facilities and to require experienced military sexual trauma counselors at veterans facilities.

SJM 12

Urges Congress to adopt Veterans Remembered Flag.

Work Session

HB 2848

Directs Adjutant General to form commission to create Oregon Medal of Honor to be awarded to next of kin of Oregon servicemembers killed in action or who died as result of wounds received in war in Iraq or Afghanistan.

HB 2019

Provides that Adjutant General may not place person in unit designated for active federal service outside state if person is sibling of person killed while serving on active duty with Armed Forces of United States.

HB 3208

Allows for development of two additional Oregon Veterans' Homes under certain circumstances.

HB 3335 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs State Parks and Recreation Commission to authorize veterans to use yurts and horse-accessible campsites without charge for certain number of days in any calendar month.

HB 2243

Allows Attorney General or Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to file civil action in relation to discrimination against person for service in uniformed service.
