SB 951

Designates June 25 of every year as Korean War Veterans Honor Day.

SJM 1 A

Urges United States Department of Veterans Affairs to place greater emphasis on transitional housing for homeless veterans.

SJM 6

Urges Congress to fund mobile health care buses for women veterans.

HB 3611

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/12/2011 AGENDA: Requires person who submits death certificate after decedent's death was caused by suicide to make reasonable efforts to ascertain and to indicate on death certificate whether decedent was veteran, whether decedent served in combat and where decedent served if decedent served in combat.

Work Session

HB 2019

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/12/2011 AGENDA: Provides that Adjutant General may not place person in unit designated for active federal service outside state if person is sibling of person killed while serving on active duty with Armed Forces of United States.

HB 2243

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/12/2011 AGENDA: Allows Attorney General or Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to file civil action in relation to discrimination against person for service in uniformed service.

HB 2848

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/12/2011 AGENDA: Directs Adjutant General to form commission to create Oregon Medal of Honor to be awarded to next of kin of Oregon servicemembers killed in action or who died as result of wounds received in war in Iraq or Afghanistan.
