FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Removes Department of State Police as designated state point of contact for purposes of National Instant Criminal Background Check System.

HB 3615 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

FIRST PUBLIC HEARING - Authorizes establishment of regional definitions of "agricultural land" and "forest land" for purposes of land use goal setting.

#### Work Session

HB 2653 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

Expands collection mechanisms that Collections Unit of Department of Revenue may use to collect judgments in criminal actions assigned to unit by justice courts.

HB 2712

Revises laws relating to offenses.

HB 3259

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Directs Department of Transportation to provide photograph on driver license, driver permit or identification card to licensed private investigator.

HJR 34 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Rules

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution authorizing Legislative Assembly to prohibit furnishing of sexually explicit materials to minors in manner consistent with United States Constitution.

HB 2014

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Requires registered nurse to report certain injuries to medical examiner.

- HB 2142  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Provides that partial or complete drug recognition evaluation is admissible as evidence and may be used to determine whether person was driving under influence of intoxicants.
- HB 2183  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Creates crime of making a false report of child abuse.
- HB 2694  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Allows court to extend time to execute writ for eviction upon showing of good cause by sheriff.
- HB 3104  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Includes youth correction facility staff within definition of "staff member" for purposes of assault in the third degree and aggravated harassment.
- HB 3324  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Requires certain persons to install ignition interlock device for five years after person's driving privileges are restored following suspension or revocation of driving privileges.
- HB 2648  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Authorizes parole and probation officers to detain and arrest persons under certain circumstances.
- HB 2461  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Limits prohibition on using public funds to pay for direct care provided by person with conviction of theft in first degree to prohibit use of public funds only if conviction resulted in enhanced sentence due to vulnerability of victim.
- HB 2650  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Requires Oregon Health Authority and Department of Human Services to develop systems that run criminal records checks quarterly and to update criminal records check information on certain health care workers in order to minimize administrative burden on agencies and individuals in conducting subsequent criminal records checks.
- HB 2693  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Requires agency to record warrant in County Clerk Lien Record for county in which sheriff serves before issuing warrant to sheriff.
- HB 3186  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Removes exception for person operating motor vehicle in scope of person's employment from offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device.
- HB 3295 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Rules  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Allows city to order cessation of alcoholic beverage sales or other operations at premises licensed for full or limited on-premises sales or as brewery-public house upon reasonable belief that continued sales or operation are immediate threat to public safety.
- HB 3594  
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/18/2011 AGENDA - Creates offense of refusal to identify.
