Summary of Revenue Changes

Revenue to support the \$30,000 Other Funds expenditure is from fee increases in the Medical Marijuana Program within the Oregon Health Authority (OHA).

Summary of Subcommittee Action

House Bill 2380 provides for the confidentiality of information disclosed during a peer review of a direct entry midwife and establishes protections for physicians and hospitals treating patients of direct entry midwives. It eliminates a certified nurse midwife member from the State Board of Direct Entry Midwifery. The measures also transfers direct entry midwife data collection responsibilities from the Oregon Health Licensing Agency to the Center for Health Statistics within OHA.

The Ways and Means Subcommittee on Capital Construction approved \$30,000 Other Funds to OHA, Center for Health Statistics for startup costs to collect and report data on birth and fetal deaths, including intrapartum and neonatal transfers to hospital care from another birthing facility, hospital, or other location. Data must be reported by the attendant type, including direct entry midwives. The Center for Health Statistics will collect this information by adding two questions to each: the electronic birth certificate and the fetal death report. The \$30,000 Other Funds is for programming required at a cost of \$6,500 for each of the four questions for a total of \$26,000. The additional \$4,000 is to change paper forms and provide training and training materials. These costs are one-time only.
