Requires Oregon Health and Science University to establish primary care transformation research and training center to facilitate use of patient centered primary care home model of health care delivery.

**Government Unit(s) Affected:**

Oregon Health Sciences University (OHSU), Department of Administrative Services (DAS)

**Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**Analysis:**

The measure requires the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) to establish a primary care transformation research and training center and specifies the function of the center. The measure requires that the Area Health Education Center within OHSU shall include a locum tenens program and that the Center shall adopt a fee schedule for services provided. Additionally, the Area Health Education Center must also include an interdisciplinary continuing medical education program. The measure continuously appropriates moneys in the Rural Health Services Fund to the Department of Administrative Services for allocation to the Office of Rural Health at OHSU.

The measure appropriates \$400,000 of General Fund to OHSU for the primary care transformation research and training center, \$300,000 for establishment and operation of the locum tenens program, and \$700,000 for establishing and operating the interdisciplinary continuing medical education program.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Health Care Committee to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
