Measure Description:

Makes various changes to declaratory judgements.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Judicial Department

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: The cost to implement the measure the Oregon Judicial Department (OJD) is minimal.

OJD estimates that this measure will reduce temporary court fee revenue to the Judicial System Surcharge Account by \$5350 to \$8,560 (see HB 2287 from 2009). Judicial System Surcharge Account monies are distributed to OJD (65%) and the Public Defense Services Commission (35%) and used to fund court services and trial-level public defense respectively. Therefore, OJD and PDSC will see less distributed revenue to fund these expenditures.
