### **Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

# **Analysis:**

The measure directs the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to conduct a feasibility study regarding the development of a zone to improve fish habitat and report the results of the study to the legislature no later than February 1, 2013.

ODFW indicates that a typical fish habitat improvement feasibility study involves an assessment of instream flow needs, stream structure and possible riparian habitat improvements. ODFW assumes that they will conduct an independent feasibility study in cooperation with other entities. One-time expenditures include personal services charges of \$110,355 General Fund for a Natural Resource Specialist 3 and field crews to assess stream structures, document necessary habitat improvements, and prepare the required report of the Legislature. The Department indicates they would hire a contractor to conduct necessary in-stream water flow analysis at an estimated cost of \$120,000 General Fund.
