Measure Description:

Approves certain new or increased fees adopted by the Oregon Health Licensing Agency.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Summary of Revenue Impact: See Analysis**Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

ORS 291.055(1)(e) requires all new state agency fees or fee increases adopted after July 1 of any odd-numbered year to be rescinded on July 1 unless authorized by enabling legislation setting forth the approved fees. This bill provides the enabling legislation necessary to approve fees adopted through Administrative Rule by the Oregon Health Licensing Agency during the 2009-11 interim. Fees were adjusted for the Board of Cosmetology, including business authorization, certification renewals, and reciprocity application fees. The bill establishes special event permits for tattoo conventions, and modifies the delinquency fees for the Board of Direct Entry Midwifery, Respiratory Therapist Licensing, and Sex Offender Treatment Board. These fee modifications are anticipated to create \$635,415 Other Funds revenue during the 2011-13 biennium. The 2011-13 budget assumes the continuation of the revenue from the fees included in this bill.
