Measure Description:

Provides that offenders sentenced to mandatory minimum terms of imprisonment for certain crimes committed when they were 15, 16 or 17 years of age are eligible for conditional release hearing after having served one-half of sentence imposed.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Corrections, Judicial Department, Public Defense Services Commission, Oregon Youth Authority (OYA), District Attorneys and their Deputies

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Judiciary to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
