

## FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Measure: SB 504 - A

Seventy-Sixth Oregon Legislative Assembly – 2011 Regular Session  
Legislative Fiscal Office

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### Measure Description:

Extends suspension of driving privileges beyond end of suspension period if person fails to submit proof of installation of required ignition interlock device.

### Government Unit(s) Affected:

Judicial Department, Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT)

### Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**Analysis:** Under this bill, if the defendant's license was suspended as a result of failure to submit proof of installation of the device, the defendant would have his or her license suspended until the Department of Transportation (ODOT) receives notification that the interlock device has been installed. The defendant would also be required to use the device for additional time to make up for the required amount of time of installation they missed.

The Oregon Department of Transportation reports that the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will incur costs associated with increased transactions and computer programming costs. DMV estimates ongoing costs of approximately \$97,000 per biennium and programming costs in the 2011-13 biennium of approximately \$230,000. DMV also notes that due to the amount of computer programming required to implement the requirements of this bill, they will not be able to meet the effective date of the bill. It is important to note that DMV analyzes all legislation that passes and develops a work plan to complete the necessary work. Therefore, while each bill is analyzed for changes as if that were the only change necessary, actual programming time could be reduced due to efficiencies. ODOT will develop a work plan to address all computer changes required to conform DMV systems to enacted legislation. The department will then appear before the Legislative Assembly or the Emergency Board, if necessary, to request an expenditure limitation increase to address the required work.

The Oregon Judicial Department anticipates a minimal fiscal.
