Changes name of Respiratory Therapist Licensing Board to Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board.

**Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**Analysis:**

The measure expands the Respiratory Therapist Licensing Board at the Oregon Health Licensing Agency (OHLA) to incorporate the practice of Polysomnographic Technologists, creating a new licensee group. OHLA would be responsible for the licensing and regulatory oversight, requiring the creation of rules, investigation of complaints, and the addition of two new board members.

OHLA expects to license about 375 Polysomnographic Technologists in the 2011-13 Biennium. Fee revenue would be generated from license application, licensure, renewals, informational packets, late fees.
