Measure Description: Adjusts the sunset dates for two tax credits related to farmworker housing – the housing construction credit and the lender’s credit – to dates that are currently blank.

Impact Explanation: The preliminary revenue impact assumes the sunset dates are extended beyond the 2015-17 biennium and are based on the historical use of the tax credits. The construction credit is claimed by roughly 50 taxpayers each year. Including carryforwards, the average revenue loss is roughly one million dollars per year. The lender’s credit is generally claimed by fewer than ten taxpayer’s each year, with a total revenue loss of less than one million dollars per year. Further analysis will be conducted when the bill is in the Joint Committee on Tax Credits.
