**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Requires a registered nurse to report certain injuries to a medical examiner.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Existing "mandatory reporter" classes
- Nurses currently facing liability for making what would otherwise be a mandatory report
- Frequency with which nurses, over and above doctors and other mandatory reporters, encounter physical evidence of abuse

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** ORS 146.750 requires any physician, including residents and interns, who has probable cause to believe that a person coming before that physician has been injured in a non accidental way, to report such injury immediately to an appropriate medical examiner. House Bill 2014-A expands this requirement to cover registered nurses.

For the purposes of this section, "injury" is defined as a physical injury caused by a knife, gun, pistol or other dangerous or deadly weapon, or a serious physical injury. "Serious physical injury" is a physical injury which creates a substantial risk of death or which causes serious and protracted disfigurement, protracted impairment of health or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily organ.
