WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows Oregon State Police (OSP) to enter into real property transactions necessary for specialized services. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Duplication of oversight/project management duties by both OSP and the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) when DAS owns building that will be outfitted to house specialized services
- Rulemaking authority not limited to terms of measure

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Adds dispatch centers to list of examples of specialized services. Removes language regarding rulemaking authority.

BACKGROUND: Oregon State Police does not currently have the authority to own real property.
