WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires a person under the age of eighteen to take an approved driver education course prior to receiving a provisional driver license if they reside in Clackamas, Multnomah, or Washington counties.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Teen driving programs are a proven method of reducing teen fatalities •
- May harm private driver education companies that do not wish to comply with Oregon Department of • Transportation's driving guidelines
- Mandatory driver education has not shown any reduction in discounts offered from insurance companies • for successfully completing a driver education course
- All driving schools must have a program to address financial hardship •

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Oregon currently has a provisional driver license program for teens. Oregon Department of Transportation studies show that driver education courses, coupled with a provisional license, are the most effective way to prevent casualties among teen drivers. House Bill 2140 would be a phase-in to requiring driver education in Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington counties to require driver's education courses as a requirement to obtaining a provisional license.
