WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Prohibits the use of intoxicants for both juvenile and adult diversion participants, with exceptions.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Types of sanctions imposed on violators in diversion courts for the unauthorized use of intoxicants
- Prescription medication and diversion participants
- Possible religious exemption which would allow for communion and similar
- Prohibition of the possession of intoxicants as a standard condition for those on standard DUII probation

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Adds exceptions for prescription medications and religious use.

BACKGROUND: ORS 813.200 requires the court to inform at the time of arraignment a defendant who is charged with the offense of driving under the influence (DUII) that a diversion agreement may be available. ORS 419C.225 authorizes a county juvenile department to refer a youth to an authorized diversion program under a formal accountability agreement for violations of ORS 813.010 (criminalizing DUII). Diversion requires participants to undergo a court mandated alcohol ? and course of treatment alongside other obligations. As a condition of participation in diversion, participants are required to agree not to use intoxicants in conjunction with the operation of a motor vehicle during the term of diversion. House Bill 2141 A modifies this section to require participants not to use intoxicants at any time, whether or not this use is associated with the operation of a motor vehicle. Exceptions are allowed for the consumption of sacramental wine given or provided as part of a religious rite or service and controlled substances used as directed pursuant to a doctor's prescription.
