WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows Oregon Board of Massage Therapists (OBMT) to approve class taken at accredited college or university as certified class for the purpose of educational requirements for licensure. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

MEASURE: HB 2155

CARRIER: Sen. Bates

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Prevalence of students taking classes at colleges and universities
- Change in name of Western States Chiropractic College to University of Western States

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: OBMT regulates the practice of massage. OBMT is responsible for licensure of massage therapists, establishing educational requirements, administration of tests to establish minimum competency to practice and enforcing professional behavior and standards.

To become a massage therapist in Oregon the applicant must meet the educational requirements, pass the current Oregon Practical Exam, and pass OBMT approved written exam. The educational requirements are a minimum of 500 hours. If the applicant lacks any hours or subject matter, additional education is required before being approved for the Oregon Practical Exam.

House Bill 2155 provides OBMT the flexibility to consider and approve schools that offer specific educational classes that will assist applicants in obtaining the necessary educational requirements for licensure.
