WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Establishes exemption from excise tax on use of fuel in motor vehicles for diesel fuel blended with minimum of 20 percent biodiesel derived from used cooking oil, when that fuel is used in vehicles having gross weight up to 10,000 pounds.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Number of businesses that collect used cooking oil, and uses to which they currently put that oil
- Carbon emissions of biodiesel made from used cooking oil

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces measure.

BACKGROUND: ORS 319.530 currently imposes an excise tax on the use of fuel in a motor vehicle. House Bill 2196 A would establish an exemption to that tax for vehicles powered by biodiesel made from used cooking oil.
