**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** HB 2210 allows counties to be reimbursed for traffic safety classes provided by driver education schools from the Student Driver Training Fund.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Many counties in Eastern Oregon cannot offer driver education classes without state support
- Driver education proven to reduce accidents among teenagers

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Oregon Statutes already allows for reimbursement to commercial or public driving schools. House Bill 2210 extends that same privilege to counties.
