WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Exempts from public records disclosure, unless the public interest requires disclosure in a particular instance, any document or other information related to an audit of a public body until the final audit report is issued or the audit is abandoned. Allows disclosure of the draft audit report provided to the public body being audited.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

REVENUE: No revenue impact

- Desire to complete audits in timely and accurate manner
- Work papers can be taken out of context
- Position of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association
- Ability to track changes between draft and final audit

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the original measure.

BACKGROUND: The audits affected by House Bill 2247-A are those that are conducted under nationally recognized auditing standards. The proposed disclosure restriction is intended to extend confidentiality only to work that is professionally conducted.
