WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Amends the statutory definitions of all-terrain vehicles to add a Class IV vehicle type. Expands membership of the All-Terrain Vehicle Advisory Committee to fourteen members to add a person knowledgeable about enforcement of all terrain vehicles law, a representative of the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and a person who represents persons with disabilities.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Types of all-terrain vehicles
- Business and recreational uses of all-terrain vehicles
- The measure is a result of a work group
- All-terrain vehicle fees being used for purposes other than to maintain all-terrain vehicle trails

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Expands membership of the All-Terrain Vehicle Advisory Committee to fourteen members to include a person who represents persons with disabilities.

BACKGROUND: A new, larger type of all-terrain vehicle (ATV) has emerged on the market not classified under the current statutes. By amending the current law, the new ATVs will be included in a class IV category. The measure keeps with current practice and does not amend where ATVs can be driven.
