WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Creates crime prohibiting person convicted of certain crimes involving animals from owning, being employed by or providing services at animal grooming parlor or kennel for specified period following conviction. Increases punishment for subsequent conviction. Creates crime and civil penalty prohibiting owner of grooming parlor or kennel from knowingly hiring a prohibited person. Creates crime and civil penalty prohibiting boarding kennels that accommodate 10 or more adult dogs from violating enclosure and recordkeeping requirements. Authorizes Department of Agriculture to investigate noncompliance.
