WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows Department of Revenue (DOR) to collect judgments of interest to the state, ordered by justice courts in criminal cases. Requires justice courts to report on collections.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

Provisions of measure

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Limits use of DOR to collections of state interest. Requires report on collections from justice courts using DOR.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 2653 A was filed at the request of the Interim Committee on Consumer Protection and Government Accountability for the Task Force on Effective and Cost-Efficient Service Provision. Justice courts are currently responsible for collection of judgments ordered by them. House Bill 2653 A permits them to use the Department of Revenue to collect judgments that involve state monies.
