REVENUE: No revenue impact

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires issuance of restraining order to prohibit contact with victim of domestic violence or sex crime while defendant is in custody. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Gap or loophole that permits contact with victim while defendant is in custody
- Importance of restraining orders in overall scheme of prevention and enforcement
- Provisions of -2 amendment

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Requires issuance of restraining order to prohibit contact with victim while defendant is in custody.

BACKGROUND: Oregon law currently provides for issuance of restraining orders upon release of a defendant to prohibit contact with a victim. House Bill 2925 A provides for such orders during the period of time a defendant is in custody.
