**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Requires the Oregon Department of Transportation to erect a roadside memorial sign to honor an officer killed in the line of duty.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

• Fitting tribute to those who have sacrificed their lives

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Eliminates language directing the Department of Transportation to maintain a memorial for three years.

**BACKGROUND:** In lieu of personal roadside memorials that are often removed, fall into disarray, or serve as distractions, House Bill 3039 creates an official way to memorialize deceased public safety officers. House Bill 3039-A creates a memorial to assuage personal roadside memorials to enhance public safety near highways.
