WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows a household member of an officer killed in the line of duty to continue to utilize confidential addresses.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Need to protect spouses of fallen public safety officers from media scrutiny
- Protecting personal privacy
- Support for measure by the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Current law requires that persons provide their residential address for their vehicle records with the Oregon Department of Transportation's Driver and Motor Vehicle Services Division (DMV). It also provides an exception for law enforcement, corrections professionals, and other eligible public employees to instead use their employment address. House Bill 3273 A allows the immediate family to elect to continue to use the employment address for DMV records for up to four years in cases where the eligible public employee was killed in the line of duty.
