**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Establishes World War II Task Force to arrange for development, design and construction of memorial to honor Oregon's World War II veterans.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Work of World War II Memorial Planning Committee
- Most states have a World War II Memorial on their capitol grounds
- Need to act quickly since 1,000 World War II veterans die daily

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Delineates only private funding will be used for construction of memorial.

**BACKGROUND:** There were 152,000 Oregonians who served in World War II, 3,757 of whom lost their lives. At present, Oregon is home to 30,000 World War II veterans. While a number of local memorials for World War II veterans exist, currently there are no statewide memorials commemorating Oregon's World War II veterans. Former Governor Kulongoski established a World War II Memorial Planning Committee. House Bill 3416 gives Legislative support to the World War II Memorial Planning Committee.
