**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Reduces nonresident commercial-fishing fees to no more than \$50 more than resident fees.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Pending litigation
- Provisions of the measure
- Proposed amendment that would restrict Columbia River gillnet fishing

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Allows the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission to charge the correct fee for the fishing year for which the license is issued, regardless of when the license is renewed.

**BACKGROUND:** Under current statute, nonresident commercial fishing fees are more than double residential fees, some as much as eight times higher, a possible violation of the equal protection clause (14<sup>th</sup> Amendment) of the U.S. Constitution. A lawsuit is said to be pending. House Bill 3657-A changes nonresident fees, making them consistently \$50 more than residential fees. Fee schedules:
