WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Reduces Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission nonresident commercial-fishing fees to no more than \$50 more than resident fees.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Fiscal impact of the bill
- Provisions of the measure

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Under current statute, nonresident commercial fishing fees are more than double residential fees, some as much as eight times higher, a possible violation of the equal protection clause (14th amendment) of the federal Constitution. A lawsuit is said to be pending. House Bill 3657-A changes nonresident fees, making them consistently \$50 more than residential fees. Fee schedules:
