WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Commemorates the City of Eagle Point on the 100th anniversary of its incorporation, February 16, 2011.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: The City of Eagle Point is twelve miles northeast of Medford on the Crater Lake Highway, State Highway 62, in the Upper Rogue area of Jackson County. The Eagle Point golf course, a Robert Trent Jones II Pro Am 18-hole course, has four sets of tees ranging from the green tees at 5091 yards to the black tees at 7099 yards. The semi-private course was selected in the top 10 public courses by Golf Week Magazine for 2007, ranked 8th amongst public courses in Oregon in Golf Digest's "Best Places to Play" for 2009, and is ranked 11th best in Oregon by the Oregon Golf Association. Eagle Creek is also home of the Butte Creek Mill and General Store, which began operating in 1872 and is still one of Southern Oregon's favorite destinations for culinary treats and history.
