WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Stipulates that Deputy State Treasurer may, in event of a vacancy in office of State Treasurer, exercise duties of State Treasurer. Specifies that Deputy State Treasurer maintains duties assigned by former State Treasurer until modified by subsequent State Treasurer. Changes title of Chief Deputy State Treasurer to Deputy State Treasurer. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

## ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Duties to be transferred
- Length of time office of Treasurer could be vacant
- Statutory duties of Treasurer

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Office of State Treasurer is one of six statewide elected positions in Oregon. The Treasurer oversees an office comprised of five divisions: Investment, Debt Management, Finance, Executive, and Information Services. The State Treasury manages nearly \$70 billion in state dollars, including the Oregon Public Employees Retirement Fund, State Accident Insurance Fund, and Oregon Short Term Fund, among others. The Treasurer also provides central coordination of all state-issued debt, including over \$6 billion in general obligation and revenue bonds, and certificates of participation.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of State Treasurer, the authority of the Deputy State Treasurer to act in his or her stead until a replacement is appointed exists only in case law; no statutory authority exists for the Deputy State Treasurer in such instances. Senate Bill 11 provides statutory authority for the Deputy State Treasurer to act in official capacity in the event of an unexpected vacancy. Such authority remains until a replacement is duly sworn in, at which time the Deputy retains only such additional powers as were granted by the previous State Treasurer. These powers are retained until modified, rescinded, or reauthorized by the new State Treasurer.

The current State Treasurer, Ted Wheeler, was appointed to the position by then-Governor Ted Kulongoski following the death of State Treasurer Ben Westlund. The office was vacant for two days; the quick appointment of Mr. Wheeler as successor was due primarily to the imminent filing deadline for the 2010 Primary Election.

Senate Bill 11 also makes technical changes to terminology related to the staff of the State Treasurer, including the Deputy State Treasurer.
