WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows Department of State Police to publish specified information about predatory, sexually-violent offenders on its website by city, zip code or county. Requires information about juvenile offenders to be provided on a request-by-request basis when the offender is identified by full name. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of measure
- Amended by the Department of State Police at the request of Youth, Rights and Justice and the Oregon Youth Authority to make release of information about juveniles consistent with other measures

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Requires information about juvenile offenders to be provided on a request-by-request basis when the offender is identified by full name.

BACKGROUND: Law enforcement agencies and entities that supervise sex offenders in Oregon are required to release information about sex offenders, upon request, as necessary to protect the public (ORS 181.592.). Senate Bill 67 A would allow internet publication.
