WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Designates March 30 of every year as Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day.

CARRIER: Sen. Boquist

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Treatment of Vietnam veterans
- Reason for designating March 30
- Clarification of impact on work day
- Reaction of veterans from other wars
- Potential day to honor Korean War veterans

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: The Vietnam War ("the war") had significant American involvement from 1961 to 1975. More than 58,000 United States Armed Forces (USAF) personnel died and more than 300,000 were wounded during the war. Public debate about the war was extensive and many returning USAF members were not immediately honored for their service. More than 118,000 of Oregon's citizens served in the war, and they, and other Vietnam veterans from around the country, commonly greet each other with the words, "Welcome home." A number of states, including California, have designated a Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day.

Senate Bill 74 recognizes Oregon's Vietnam veterans and establishes an annual day for honoring their service.
