**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Repeals statute that establishes the now-obsolete Interagency Shared Information System.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

• Original system, one of the first of its kind, is now defunct

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Interagency Shared Information System (SIS) was established in 1993 to allow the participation of several state agencies, including the Employment Department, Department of Human Services, Department of Education, the Oregon University System and the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for the purposes of measuring outcomes of individuals served by the state's workforce system. After several years of operation, the partner agencies worked to develop a new, more flexible system, resulting in the development of the Performance Reporting Information System (PRISM) in 2001 (Senate Bill 400). Final transition to PRISM was finalized with the passage of Senate Bill 250 in 2003.

No new data has been provided to the SIS since 2004; no requests for analysis have been received for the system for several years. Senate Bill 109 repeals the statutes that created the Interagency Shared Information System.
