**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Exempts person applying for restricted motorcycle endorsement for operation of motorcycle with more than two wheels from meeting requirements for motorcycle endorsement.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Definition of a motorcycle
- Consistency with federal definitions and standards
- Expansion of alternative vehicle types
- Small percentage of three wheeled vehicles on the road

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** To qualify for a motor cycle endorsement, applicants must meet basic criteria: apply in person at a Driver and Motor Vehicle Services Division (DMV) office; be a resident of Oregon; be at least 16 years of age; possess or qualify for an Oregon Drivers license; have full driving privileges in Oregon or any other state; submit a Driver License/ID Card Application; have no medical condition that inhibits one's ability to drive; if under 18, parent or guardian signature; provide DMV with standard documentation and identification; complete testing and training requirements; vision screening; pay insurance fees.

Current statute limits motorcycle endorsement exemptions to individuals that currently hold an endorsement by another state. Senate Bill 133 extends exemptions to individuals seeking a restricted motorcycle endorsement for the purpose of operating a motorcycle with more than two wheels.
