WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Resolves conflict between House Bill 2281 (2011), relating to residential treatment programs and House Bill 3599 (2011), relating to education of students in day treatment programs. Allows day treatment programs and residential treatment programs to co-exist within Oregon Department of Education long-term care and treatment funding statute.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Resolves conflicts.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 2281 and House Bill 3599 amend the same Oregon Department of Education long-term care and treatment funding statute with different provisions. The provisions from both measure need to co-exist within the statute.
