**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Repeals statutes relating to the Space Age Industrial Park.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Need to clean up language
- Statutory language creates additional work for local planning officials

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** In 1963, the Boeing Company leased around 100,000 acres in rural eastern Oregon from the State of Oregon. At that time, the Legislative Assembly enacted several provisions in ORS 273 to regulate the management of the property referred to in statute as the Space Age Industrial Park. In 2000, the State of Oregon began the process of selling the property to a variety of land owners including Threemile Canyon Farms, the Port of Morrow, the City of Boardman, and a couple of other owners with small parcels. The State of Oregon no longer owns any property in what was the Space Age Industrial Park.
