WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Senate Bill 224 modifies certain provisions relating to regulation of physician assistants. Requires that physician assistant enter into a practice agreement with a supervising physician that enumerates a number of items related to the scope of practice of the physician assistant and acknowledges that a violation of laws or regulations governing the practice of medicine may subject the physician assistant and supervising physician or supervising physician organization to disciplinary actions.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: PAs practice medicine as members of a team with their supervising physicians. PAs are certified by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants and state-licensed.
