WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to review rules relating to patient data and information provided to OHA by mental health and addiction treatment providers. Requires OHA to determine if excessive requirements and redundancies can be eliminated and the process streamlined. Requires OHA to adopt standardized forms. Requires OHA to appoint a work group to advise OHA in review and development of rules and forms. Defines membership of work groups. Requires department to adopt or amend rules or forms no later than January 1, 2012. Requires OHA to report to the Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Mental health and addiction services providers serving Oregon medical assistance beneficiaries must provide the state with data that, in part, is used to comply with federal laws, including the Public Health Service Act. These federal laws require states to report data that support and document the use of federal funds.
