WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Limits disclosure of record of civil commitment proceeding to parties while pending and on appeal. Requires appellate court to protect identity of subject of proceedings in its opinions. Conforms disclosures to comply with federal law. Authorizes Chief Justice of Oregon Supreme Court to determine effective date of sections 2 and 4. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Measure prepares statutes to work electronically in anticipation of eCourt
- No change in protections already in place in lower courts being extended to cases on appeal
- Conflict amendment has no substantive effect

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Resolves conflict with Senate Bill 68, should both measures pass into law.

BACKGROUND: Senate Bill 390 A comes from the Oregon Judicial Department. It anticipates electronic access but does not alter the protection of subjects of commitment proceedings.
