WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Prohibits health insurers from demanding refund of payment made to satisfy a claim of a health care provider more than 18 months after the date of payment.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Difficulty in tracking payments over extended periods of time
- Typical timelines for billing insurance companies for services provided

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Changes deadline for requesting refund of payment from six months to 18 months after the date the payment was made.

BACKGROUND: Under current law, health insurers may request a refund of payment made to a health care provider in writing, including the reasons the insurer believes that the provider owes the refund, within 24 months after the date the payment was made. Senate Bill 573-AMR reduces the period during which an insurer may request a refund from a health provider from 24 months to 18 months.
