WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires instruction in Oregon Studies in grade six, seven or eight for a minimum of two semesters. Takes effect July 1, 2012.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: ORS 329.007 defines Oregon Studies as history, geography, economics and civics specific to the State of Oregon. Oregon Studies instruction in Oregon government includes municipal, county, tribal and state government, as well as the electoral and legislative processes. Currently, Oregon history is taught in the fourth grade. Senate Bill 602 requires that Oregon studies be taught in grades six, seven or eight for a minimum of two semesters. Over half of the states that have similar dedicated courses on their state's history, government, culture and geography offer it in the middle school or above.
