WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Provides judgment debtor with increased exemption from execution of tools, implements, apparatus, team, harness or library that is necessary to carry on trade, occupation or profession from \$3,000 to \$5,000. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Need to protect livelihood in cases of bankruptcy
- Increased cost of tools
- Increased number of persons needing to declare bankruptcy

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Current statute provides that debtor exemptions from execution of tools, implements, apparatus, team, harness or library relating to one's profession and ability to earn a living is valued at \$3,000. This exemption was last amended 1993, increasing the value from \$750 (est. 1981) to the current value. Senate Bill 935 increases the exemption value to \$5,000, reflecting cost-of-living adjustments.
