WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Adjourns sine die 2011 regular session of Seventh-sixth Legislative Assembly

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Conclusion of 2011 Legislative Session
- Experience and work of Senate Committee on Rules during session

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Latin term *sine die* literally means "adjournment without a day" and the *sine die* resolution is used to connote the final adjournment of a legislative session, without adjourning to a specific time or date. The resolution, to be valid, must be adopted in the same form by both chambers. Because the blanks in the original version are ordinarily filled in with the date, effort has been made in previous sessions to amend the resolution during the last hours of the final day of session.

Past practice has called for the chambers to alternate introducing the resolution; House Concurrent Resolution 10 ended the 2009 session and Senate Concurrent Resolution 19 ended the 2010 Special Legislative Session. By Oregon legislative tradition, at the time of *sine die*, the main doors of both chambers are opened so that the presiding officers may view each other, and the final adjournment gavels fall simultaneously.
