

A-Engrossed House Bill 2014

Ordered by the House April 28
Including House Amendments dated April 28

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires registered nurse to report certain injuries to [*medical examiner*] **appropriate law enforcement agency**.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to reports of injuries; amending ORS 146.750.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 146.750 is amended to read:

5 146.750. (1) Except as required in subsection (3) of this section, [*any*] **a** physician, including
6 [*any*] **an** intern and resident, **or a registered nurse licensed under ORS 678.010 to 678.410**, [*hav-*
7 *ing*] **who has** reasonable cause to suspect that a person brought to the physician **or registered**
8 **nurse** or coming before the physician **or registered nurse** for examination, care or treatment has
9 had injury, as defined in ORS 146.710, inflicted upon the person other than by accidental means,
10 shall report or cause reports to be made in accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of this
11 section.

12 (2) An oral report [*shall*] **must** be made immediately by telephone or otherwise, and followed
13 as soon thereafter as possible by a report in writing, to [*the appropriate medical examiner*] **an ap-**
14 **propriate law enforcement agency**.

15 (3) When [*either*] an injury as defined in ORS 146.710 or abuse as defined in ORS 419B.005 occurs
16 to an unmarried person who is under 18 years of age, the provisions of ORS 419B.005 to 419B.050
17 [*shall*] apply.
