SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates Constitutional Commission to make recommendations to Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly in 2013 on revisions to Oregon Constitution.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to a Constitutional Commission.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) A Constitutional Commission is created to:

5 (a) Study the laws and Constitution of this state for the purpose of redrafting the Oregon

7 (b) Make recommendations to the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly on changes to

8 the Oregon Constitution.

9 (2) The commission has 12 members, appointed as follows:

10 (a) Four members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;

(b) Four members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the
 House of Representatives;

(c) Two members, appointed by the Governor, who have a thorough knowledge of the
 history of the State of Oregon, the laws and Constitution of the State of Oregon and con stitutional principles in general; and

(d) Two members, appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, who have a
thorough knowledge of the history of the State of Oregon, the laws and Constitution of the
State of Oregon and constitutional principles in general.

(3) Appointments to the commission shall be made no later than March 15, 2012. The
 commission shall elect a chairperson, and shall meet at such times and places as the commission finds necessary.

(4) The commission shall make the recommendations described in subsection (1)(b) of this
 section to the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly on or before February 4, 2013.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2011 Act is repealed January 2, 2014.
